#### Introduction/Background

- The law as we know it protects entities or individuals that have rights and duties
- The debate as to whether the environment or Natural recourses have rights per se is an evolving conversation
- •The emergency and evolution of earth Jurisprudence is key to this debate
- "Common Law Duty to care" is an attempt to make environmental rights Justiciable



### Rational for Duty To care in Environmental Protection

>Should a the duty to care for the environment be statutory or common law?



### The Concept of Duty To care

- One person owes a duty of care not to injure the person or property of another
- Hinged on the Neighbor Principle
  "a person should take reasonable care to avoid acts or omissions that s/he can reasonably foresee as likely to cause injury to the neighbor" Lord Atkins in <a href="Donoghue">Donoghue</a> v Stevenson
- The common law actions in **trespass**, **nuisance** and **negligence** are, by implication or explicitly, founded on the duty to care.
- ➤ However, the common law does not recognize that a duty of care may be owed to the environment *per se*



## So How do we Use the duty to care to protect the Environment?



#### Duty To care Owed to an Individual

- Avoid causing or contributing to land degradation that causes or may cause damage to the land of another landholder;
- Protect water resources;
- > Respect for Riparian Rights on shared resources
- ➤ The Rule in Rylands V Fletcher
- >Other torts:
  - Nuisance
  - Trespass
  - Negligence



#### Duty To care Owed to the Environment

Pollution control legislation have introduced a general duty of care owed to the

environment, rather than to individuals, eg:

- Waste Management Regulations
- Ambient Air Quality Regulations and Standards
- Laws on Water protection and Regulation



#### Conclusion

- The Common Law duty to care helps to identify cause of action in protection of the environment
- > Extends the protection accorded to individuals to the environment
- Makes environmental rights justiciable in the absence of protecting legislation
